



Suggested Itinerary:

This is by no means compulsory and should act merely as a guide line as to what your stay could look like only as and if you wish to do so.

Day 1

Arrival at Munich airport

Take the train to the main train station. Only costs approx € 10

Tickets are available at various kiosks or vending machines but not on the train.

i.e. you must purchase your ticket before you enter the train, even though there is no turn pike or any one there to control your purchase.

Conductors control the tickets at random and if caught you would have to pay a €40 fine on the spot.

A taxi would cost between € 50 & €60, very honest and reliable system but the train is simply cheaper and probably just as fast and a lot more fun.

Either way it takes about 45 minutes from the airport to the main train station and all our partner hostels/hostels are within 4 stops of the main train station or max of 15 min walking distance

Once at the main train station make your way to your hostel by train, tram, bus, or by foot.

Your train ticket is valid for all the public transport systems, train, tram or bus.

Arrival at hostel:

Please check in as soon as possible even if you are hours to early and it is way before the allowed

Check in time, you may still check in and leave your luggage in the luggage room until you are actually allowed into your room.





Very important:

Do not leave any valuables in your luggage as the hostel is not responsible for any loss or damage of items. All hostels have safety deposit boxes or will take your valuables and lock them up for you.

After you have completed your checking in experience we now suggest that you familiarize yourself with your surroundings.

With your check in you should receive a free map of the city as well as a free Munich city guide, you should sit down and study these to see where you are in relation to the Oktoberfest, the main train station and the city centre's Marienplatz which is also the very large pedestrian zone and where your free tour starts from.

Now depending on the time of day or night we suggest you make your way over to the largest beer festival in the world and grab yourself a liter or two of beer, making sure that you have something to eat before you indulge in the night's festivities.

We suggest you try the world famous grilled $\frac{1}{2}$ a chicken with your very first beer along with one of those huge pretzels as this will provide you with the perfect sustenance for a good healthy drinking session.

WARNING

This might sound silly but almost all tourists on their first visit underestimate the strength of the Oktoberfest beer and that is especially brewed for this occasion and simply tastes like MORE & MORE and before you know it you suddenly feel like you're on top of the world.

It's round about this time that many tourists tend to lose their memory and can't tell you what happened the rest of the evening, so be warned!

Most beers have 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of alcohol, most German beer has 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ % of alcohol and the Oktoberfest beer (brewed exclusively) has up to 8 % of alcohol and "oh my goodness" what a difference those few percentage extra make to the taste and eventually to your behavior after consumption.

Please always carry a card from your hostel with you stating the name, address and telephone no of the establishment you are staying at for later on when you some of you tend to lose your memory and are trying to find your way home under the influence of lots of alcohol in a strange city.





Day 2

Rise and shine as early as possible after a good night's sleep.

Free walking tour which starts at 10:30am from the Marienplatz and will show you some of the important and historical sites Munich has to offer. Tour duration 3 ½ hours
